## Policy

(Personal, Social, Health, Emotional and Relationships and Sex Education)

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## Intent


#### Abstract

Aims: The National Curriculum states that 'all schools should make provision for personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE), drawing on good practice.' According to the Education Act 2002 and the Academies Act 2010, the PSHE curriculum should be a balanced and broadly-based curriculum which 'promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils at the school and of society, and prepares pupils at the school for opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.'


#### Abstract

At Woodloes Primary School, we celebrate the fact that we are a diverse family and believe that individual uniqueness should be celebrated. Just like no fingerprint is the same, everyone within our school is different; therefore, our role as educators is to support our students in embracing uniqueness and individuality. At Woodloes, we want our pupils to feel safe and supported when exploring who they are, and for them to develop confidence and self-esteem.


As a school, we want the children to embrace differences, challenge disrespect and care for one another. These fundamental skills are vital to become successful individuals who contribute in a positive manner in the local and wider community. As well as promoting mutual respect and tolerance, we also want to provide individuals with necessary life skills to manage any future challenges.

The wellbeing of our pupils is paramount and supporting them through times of change is vital. Therefore, we aim to provide the skills required to self-regulate emotions, articulate worries and concerns to enable them to become confident, competent learners.

## Relationships and Sex Education - RSE (2020 statutory guidance and implementation):

RSE is included within the PSHE curriculum; at Woodloes Primary School, this also incorporates the optional section of sex education. We focus on developing the fundamental building blocks and characteristics of positive relationships, with particular reference to friendships, family relationships and relationships with other children and adults. This includes positive emotional health, including how friendships can support mental wellbeing. The 3D PSHE scheme teaches pupils, in an ageappropriate way, what a healthy relationship is, enabling them to form a clear understanding of the features of positive relationships that are likely to lead to fulfilment, happiness and security.

Our school's use of 3D PSHE and Medway Primary PSHE Education resources, approved by the PSHE Association, teaches pupils about families in a sensitive way, based on a clear knowledge of the pupils and their circumstances, reflecting that some children have different family structures and supportive relationships. They learn how to take turns; how to treat each other with kindness, consideration and respect; the importance of honesty and truthfulness; permission seeking and giving; and the
concept of personal privacy. Establishing personal space and boundaries and showing respect and understanding, including the differences between appropriate and inappropriate or unsafe physical contact, are the forerunners of teaching about consent, which prepares the pupils for further detailed content in secondary school.

The pupils learn about online safety and appropriate behaviour online, including sharing data and ways in which information provided by users may be used negatively. Pupils also learn about safe relationships, focusing on boundaries and privacy and ensuring that they understand that they have rights over their own bodies. This also covers understanding boundaries in friendships with peers, in families and with others, in all contexts, including online. In 3D PSHE, pupils are taught how to report concerns and seek advice when they suspect or know that something is wrong. Of paramount importance is ensuring the balance between informing children about making sensible decisions to stay safe (including online) without frightening them unnecessarily, whilst also making it clear that it is never the fault of a child who is exploited or abused, and why victim blaming is always wrong.

We use the Medway Primary PSHE resources, approved by the PSHE Association to plan and deliver sex education and puberty sessions. This is tailored to the age and the physical and emotional maturity of our pupils and supports pupils' ongoing emotional and physical development effectively. The teaching and materials used are appropriate with regard to religious and cultural backgrounds, make up of family units and special educational needs or disabilities of our pupils. Boys and girls are taught together to prepare them adolescence and, drawing on knowledge of the human life cycle set out in the national curriculum for science, understand how a baby is conceived and born.

Prior to teaching the sex education units, we consult parents at Woodloes Primary by requesting permission for their children to take part in the sessions; lesson objectives are also provided to parents to allow for opportunities of further discussion if required.

Parents have the right to withdraw their children from our sex education lessons and are required to state this on the permission form. Puberty session are mandatory and therefore pupils cannot be removed from these sessions. The Head Teacher / Deputy Head will be available to discuss the request with parents to ensure that their wishes are understood and to clarify the nature and purpose of the curriculum, and a record will be kept of this process. The Head Teacher/ Deputy Head will discuss the benefits of receiving this education and any detrimental effects that withdrawal might have on the child, for example the likelihood of the child hearing their peers' version of what was said in the classes, rather than what was directly said by the teacher. These detrimental effects may, of course, be mitigated if the parents propose to deliver sex education to their child at home instead. If a pupil is excused from sex education, our school will ensure that the pupil receives appropriate, purposeful education during the period of withdrawal.

## Equal Opportunities:

The school is committed to the provision of PSHE and RSE to all of its pupils. Our programme aims to respond to the diversity of children's cultures, faiths and family backgrounds. We ensure PSHE and RSE lessons are inclusive and meet the needs
of all our pupils, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) which will be considered in accordance with the SEND Policy. Teachers will be responsible for ensuring they are knowledgeable in the lessons being taught, enabling them to have the ability to adapt lessons, content and resources to the needs and abilities of the children within their class. In cases where teachers lack confidence to do so, they will be required to seek support from the PSHE lead and or the SENDCo (Special Education Needs and Disability Co-ordinator).

## Partnerships:

Our pupils are regularly consulted about their own personal, social and citizenship development through assemblies, Protective Behaviours and the Dimensions PSHE scheme. The school council play a significant role in the decision-making in respect of the children's behaviours and attitudes to learning, as set out in the Behaviour Policy. They see their roles as pivotal to their personal development and to that of others in the school community. This is evident in their moral and social responsibilities towards each other and the school and demonstrated by the strategies introduced, such as whole school celebrations or events, whole school rewards and the 'Marbles' system put in place in January 2022 (please refer to the Behaviour Policy).

All parents and carers, governors and staff were invited to a consultation in Spring Term 2019 where the 2020 statutory regulations and guidance was explained. To ensure parents and carers are aware of their child's development in PSHE, Woodloes involves them in the following ways:

- Parent drop-in sessions
- Termly report evenings
- Termly reports noting attainment and progress
- Year group emails for home/school contact


## Implementation

## Organisation:

PSHE is taught throughout each academic year as both specific teaching and through cross-curricular opportunities to enable all areas of study to be explored. At Woodloes Primary School, our PSHE programme is underpinned by the 3 Dimensions Scheme of Work, which is compliant with the PSHE Association. The scheme is divided into 3 core areas: relationships, health and wellbeing and living in the wider world, which meet the 2020 statutory government requirements. In addition to this, the school will continue to deliver Protective Behaviour sessions linked to the Warwickshire County Council Taking Care Scheme. Within the school, PSHE is clearly planned for each year group to enable progression and continuity of content.

Throughout their time at Woodloes Primary, the pupils will develop their understanding of RSE (Relationships and Sex Education). Although sex education is not compulsory within the primary sector, it provides children with factual information of bodies, families, puberty and conception within a safe environment. Parents have the right to withdraw their children from sex education sessions, however relationships education
sessions are compulsory for all pupils. Pupils will have opportunities to ask questions to clarify their understanding. When answering children's questions, teachers will adopt an honest and open approach, appropriate to the child's age and to the circumstances of the question; the teacher will make a judgement on whether an answer is more appropriate to the whole class or individually.

## PSHE Content

Dimensions 3D PSHE supports the development of the attitudes, values, skills and behaviour which enable pupils to:

- Live healthy lifestyles
- Address personal hygiene
- Develop an awareness of changing and growing
- Deal with different emotions in an appropriate way
- Keep safe
- Communicate well with others and work as a team
- Define, identify and know how to respond to bullying
- Know where and how to seek help when needed
- Treat everybody with respect
- Form and build positive relationships
- Understand the reasons for rules, and their responsibility to keep them
- Learn about their responsibility in caring for others
- Be active in their own learning
- Be active within their community
- Manage money well
- Keep safe online
- Self-assess and identify their strengths and weaknesses
- Know how to make emergency calls
- Know basic First Aid
- Work collaboratively and respectfully
- Appreciate diversity
- Empathise with other points of view
- Express opinions clearly
- Understand the changes that occur in puberty
- Develop strategies for managing changing emotions


## Teaching and Learning:

The Early Learning Goal, Physical, Emotional and Personal Development, includes positive relationships between peers and adults; takes into account others feelings and ideas so they can work cooperatively; turn-taking and sharing which are fundamental to the further development of relationships. Within these learning areas, pupils will learn how to take safe risks, have confidence in themselves and persevere when faced with new challenges and ideas. Emotional development is key to successfully working with others and developing relationships so students will develop an understanding of different emotions and begin to problem solve these feelings so they can be independent learners.

In Key Stages 1 and 2, PSHE is broken down into six units per year group, taught by class teachers over each half term. Although the majority of PSHE is taught as an isolated subject, in line with the 2020 DFE statutory guidance, it is embedded into the wider curriculum and school life, covering areas such as internet safety, healthy hearts and bodies, relationships and sex education.

## PSHE Subject Leader:

The main role of the PSHE subject leader is to support the successful planning, delivery, implementation and assessment of PSHE across the school. Throughout the academic year, the subject leader will:

- Undertake a Deep Dive (including pupil interviews, teacher questionnaires, triangulation of planning, delivery and outcome)
- Deliver CPD training sessions for staff
- Support individual staff as required with the implementation
- Ensure resources are in place for the teaching of Protective Behaviours and PSHE
- Facilitate focused events to support PSHE, such as Anti-Bullying week


## Impact

## Monitoring and Assessment:

During lessons, children are offered verbal feedback to support their achievement of lesson objectives. Following this, where appropriate, written feedback may be provided to children to allow them to reflect on learning and apply it in further contexts within the wider curriculum.

The terminology used by the programme, breaks the learning outcomes into 'emerging, expected and exceeding'. This is used by teachers to inform future planning so that they can ensure children's knowledge is secure,and supports teacher judgements linked to Woodloes' foundation assessment for PSHE.

At Woodloes Primary School, pupils' attainment and progress in PSHE is assessed using Assessing Without Levels (AWOL) skills-based targets that have been developed by the school (after reference to the National Curriculum and Cornerstones Assessment System); ensuring the accuracy of assessment relative to national standards.
