- Gaps in knowledge linked to COVID partial school lockdowns
- Safeguarding concerns
- Lower than average attendance and lateness
- Limited access to the Internet
- Limited parental engagement
- Low levels of parental engagement/ capacity to support home or remote learning
- Limited access to reading materials
- Financial hardship

## **Our Targeted Areas**

In order to continue to improve the progress and outcomes for Pupil Premium (PP) pupils, we aim to:

- Ensure that all pupils who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) have the teaching and learning opportunities to enable them to meet at least age-related expectations (ARE) and at least expected progress from their September 2021 baseline assessments
- Address SEMH issues
- Diminish gaps in knowledge created during partial school closures due to COVID
- Improve support and partnerships to ensure full access to all learning opportunities at school and home
- Enrich the lives of all PP pupils with a focus on new experiences and opportunities
- Promote high expectations and aspirations for all pupils and their families, developing a growth mindset
- Expand resources to support access to all learning opportunities for pupils in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant (PPG)
- Increase the provision and support for Pupil Premium pupils and their parents and carers beyond the school gate, including any additional support required during the current COVID-19 pandemic
